## Summer Success Program 2017 FAQ

The Summer Success Program provides an opportunity for students to complete a remedial course at no cost. The Summer Success Program is funded by the CUNY Office of Academic Affairs as part of the Coordinated Undergraduate Education initiative

- 1. Who is eligible for the Summer Success Program?**
  - Students who entered BCC as freshmen or those who transferred in the Fall 2016 and Spring 2017.
  - Incoming Freshman for Fall 2017
  - Readmit students for Fall 2017 who have earned 12 credits or less.
- 2. Which courses will be offered?**

Remedial courses in *English, ESL, Reading, and Math*.
- 3. Will the Summer Success Program be offering flexible schedules?**

**YES.** There will be morning, afternoon, and evening classes.
- 4. How will I know which sections are part of this program?**

Summer Success Program courses will have a 95 \_\_\_ or 97 \_\_\_ code. Students taking a summer college course starting with digits **other** than 95 \_\_\_ or 97 \_\_\_ will be expected to pay tuition for the course.
- 5. What is the cost of the program?**

The program *has no tuition charges*. However, students **MUST** buy books.
- 6. How do students register for the Summer Success Program?**

Counselors, advisors and faculty will advise students for summer and fall, 2017. Students can register for Summer Success Program courses after being advised. There are no waiting lists.
- 7. Can students take more than one course in the Summer Success Program?**

**NO.** Students are only allowed to take **ONE** course in the program.
- 8. Can students participate in the Summer Success Program and take other summer courses outside the program?**

**YES.** However, summer courses outside the program will have tuition costs. Students are asked to meet with an academic advisor before taking two summer courses.
- 9. What happens if students don't qualify for the Summer Success Program or if the courses are filled?**

Students can register for other summer courses, but tuition will need to be paid.
